Extend popular Coronation Drive pathway to Mt Coot-tha

<p>On-Road Cycle Path on Sir Samuel Griffith Drive Each day, cyclists climb Mt Coot-tha Road in large numbers to gain an iconic view of Brisbane while exercising. The road becomes relatively unsafe when a vehicle passes a cyclist and there's oncoming traffic, because the road is narrow, with little shoulder. A safe on-road path on one side at least is needed, when cycling anti-clockwise.</p>	<p>Fire Road Link to Chapel Hill Currently, the fire management road network does not fully connect behind houses in Chapel Hill. A fire road from the Botanic Gardens and around the low foothills of Mt Coot-tha behind houses would provide an excellent hiking and biking trail, popular as an extension of the Coronation Drive path.</p>
<p>Off-road Trail within Sir Samuel Griffith Drive Similarly, a bush trail shared by hikers and mountain bikers will provide a safe, natural trail off the ring road.</p>	<p>Anzac Park This precinct could provide a road criterium, small-scale bike track and skills areas to teach bike safety to children and new cyclists.</p>
